* Photography Pre-Shoot Checklist *

Following this checklist will help ensure that your home is photo-ready and will produce the best results!

Organize and declutter! Less is more! Let the light shine in! Clean, clean, clean!

Exterior spaces	<u>Kitchen</u>
Remove vehicles from driveway and front of house	Remove everything from surface of fridge, like
Place trash cans and other items in garage	magnets, pictures and lists
Trim trees, shrubs and remove weeds	Remove all rugs and dishtowels
Mow, water, and rake grass	Clean appliances, no fingerprints, smudges
Pressure wash driveway, walkways, pool decks	Stow away small appliances, off countertops

Hide any unnecessary clutter	Remove pet supplies and unsightly floor mats
Replace burned out lightbulbs, remove signs	
	Bathrooms
Interior spaces	Clear sink area of all personal products
Organize and DECLUTTER all rooms, removing all	Super clean all surfaces, including mirrors
unnecessary items or furniture	Stow away shower products and supplies
Remove personal information and photos, remember	Clean or replace shower curtain
these photos will be online	Clean grout or re-caullk sinks, tubs & showers
Remove all evidence of pets (beds, food, toys)	Place fresh, matching accent towels
Turn on ALL lights, including lamps, replace burned out	Remove rugs and bathmats

Remove all signs of political or religious preferences	Dining area

Bedrooms

Organize furniture to create space
Use fresh, clean bedding and pillows
Declutter and organize walk-in closet
Dust furniture and lighting, ceiling fans
Minimize items on display, remove family photos, less is more
Stow away devices, chargers, toys, cords

Laundry

Remove all clothing in machine or hanging
Organize shelving, store away as much as possible, including laundry baskets
Clean appliances, declutter, organize

How long will the shoot take?

Most shoots take 45-60 minutes. A well staged home goes faster!

What do I do with my pets?

It is best to take them off property, if possible, or kept in the garage or a kennel.

What should I do during the shoot?

If you are home, it is best to wait in one room with your children until the photographer has finished and is ready to shoot that room.

When should I start preparing?

The sooner the better! It takes time, but it's worth the effort!

Last minute double check?

Look around your house and check that all lights and lamps are on, ceiling fans are off, blinds and curtains are wide open, toilet lids are down, clutter is stowed, trash cans are hidden and everything is staged.

Remember, less is more!

Keep in mind that many strangers will be viewing these photos! Remove and personal information like calendars, password, notes, lists, and family photos.
